

Fire Restrictions in Arizona

Various state and federal agencies in Arizona have fire restrictions in place on public lands to mitigate the threat of wildfire.

Fire restrictions result from rising summer temperatures, dry weather and low moisture content in vegetation.

Restrictions can impact an agency's entire jurisdiction or be limited to designated areas. Depending on the agency, restrictions range from bans on campfires and smoking outside developed camp areas to bans on open flames.
