

Wildfire Protection Information and Resources

Arizonans can access a variety of resources to find out more about wildland fire activity, [restrictions](#), and preparedness. Statewide fire restriction information is available toll free by calling 1-877-864-6985.

The [Arizona State Forestry Division](#) provides for the prevention and suppression of wildfires on state and private lands.

The [Arizona Department of Health Services](#) has developed a tri-fold brochure to aid in preparedness and health concerns during a wildland fire. The brochure contains a color-coded scale that ties visibility to [health impacts](#), as well as a list of things to bring if evacuation is necessary, including food, water, medical supplies, documents and identification cards, and pet supplies.

The [Arizona Department of Environmental Quality](#) is providing information to residents on [prescribed fire approvals and smoke management](#). ADEQ has also created a [wildfire support page](#) that provides helpful links, as well as pertinent news releases related to air quality monitoring and post-wildfire water system recovery.

Adequate insurance protection is essential in the disaster recovery process. The [Arizona Department of Insurance](#) has a [wildfire insurance resources](#) page that provides [insurance check-up](#), [replacement costs estimators](#) and helpful insurance tips.
